

This year will again see industry representatives from around 15 countries from Eastern, Central and Western Europe discussing the latest film ideas and possibilities for European co-productions at Connecting Cottbus – market forum for the film industry at the FilmFestival Cottbus.

Following the film festival's thematic focus, the spotlight will also be on the countries of Bulgaria and Romania at Connecting Cottbus. Expert representatives from these countries will provide an overview of the most recent film productions and the situation of film financing. As in past years, the call goes out again to »Come and pitch it!«. 13 new projects are waiting for feedback, support and possible co-producers.

16TH FILMFESTIVAL COTTBUS – FESTIVAL OF EAST EUROPEAN CINEMA

Running from November 14–18, the 16th FilmFestival Cottbus has more than one hundred films from 23 countries offering a representative survey of feature film production from the whole of the Central and East European region. At the centre are the ten feature-length films and twelve short films that are competing for the »Lubina« and a total of \in 56,500 prize-money. The festival will again be directing its Focus onto the new countries to the European Union: with the choice of Bulgaria and Romania, it will be presenting two cinematographies which have attracted a lot of attention at international festivals in recent years. Two separate film programmes will present a unique panorama of works by a young generation of filmmakers who represent new beginnings at the southeastern edge of Europe. While the Bulgarian films are mainly dealing with the co-existence of various ethnic groups in this regions (»Us and Them«), the Romanian films are dedicated to »Europe's Other Youth«.

The 850th town anniversary of Cottbus is the reason for showcasing the filmmaking of the Slavic minority of Sorbs (Wends) living in Cottbus and the whole Lusatia region within a film programme. The retrospective stretches from the early silent cinema through to the most recent productions and incorporates all genres.

A children's and youth' programme, national hits as well as numerous specials complete the varied programme.
