DOES "THE EAST EUROPEAN CINEMA" REALLY EXIST?

DEAR COLLEAGUES,

Does "the East European cinema" really exist? The projects submitted this year for connecting cottbus are so diverse, and the countries they are coming from so different, that one can hardly speak of "the East European cinema".

The parameters for the production of films are also extremely different in our participating countries. And yet, there are common denominators: the words "crisis" and "niche" – don't you always hear them when people start talking about arthouse cinema? Let's meet to exchange views, now where we have reached rock bottom? Or can we possibly join forces to learn to cope with crises and emerge from them invigorated?

If one analyses the market share of East European films, Eastern Europe is almost universally present in niches. At the same time, films from Eastern Europe are consistently distinguished by original, authentic stories. By a mixture of subtle humour and a detailed power of observation, by journeys of discovery into an everyday routine full of unpredictabilities, which can be regarded in both a positive and negative sense.

All of the 83 projects from 29 countries, which were submitted to connecting cottbus this year, had this quite specific East European energy. 12 of them were selected by our jury and are complemented by last year's Special Pitch Award winner; strong stories between drama and comedy, which all have what it takes to find partners in Cottbus and mature into competitive films.

This year will again see two prizes being awarded at connecting cottbus: the "coco Best Pitch Award" and – for the second time this year – the "coco Post Pitch Award".

Alongside the pitches and the One 20ne meetings, the framework programme with panel discussions and workshops has developed into the second key pillar of connecting cottbus. On the one hand, discussion centres on information about the (East) European film funding landscape and its relevance for structuring co-productions, while other panels and workshops discuss the chances for improving the presence of East European cinema on the international market. Distribution and marketing strategies are to the fore – how can one reduce the distance between the film and its target audience? How can one reach new audiences? In spite of many debates, these are, in essence, still unanswered questions which we would like to analyse from a specifically East European perspective.

We would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to our supporters and partners, who have felt a strong bond with us over many years and have not only supported connecting cottbus financially, but also in words and deeds, as well as to our new partners who enrich our work with new aspects. We are looking forward to two days full of interesting stories, plucky pitches, inspiring conversations, honest discussions and new contacts.

COCO BEST PITCH AWARD

This year will see 13 creative teams from 12 countries vieing with one another at the annual project pitching forum to attract the interest of financiers, potential co-producers and TV commissioning editors for their projects. It is already a good tradition: the professional audience at the forum will then vote for the most convincing presentation of a new project. The producer and director (or screenwriter) receive the \in 1,500 coco Best Pitch Award during the networking reception which is jointly hosted by Medienboard Berlin-Brandenburg and Mitteldeutsche Medienförderung and held in Cottbus' Zelig Restaurant to round off this year's pitching session.

COCO SPECIAL PITCH AWARD

Winning the Main Prize of FilmFestival Cottbus is connected each year with the connecting cottbus Special Pitch Award. This prize has now proven to be a particularly innovative link between the film festival and the market: in 2011, the Russian director Angelina Nikonova won the Main Prize of FilmFestival Cottbus with TWILIGHT PORTRAIT. This year, we welcome her and her producer and main actress, Olga Dihovichnaya, who will also be part of the main jury of the FilmFestival Cottbus, to pitch her new project.

COCO POST PITCH AWARD

The post-production-company The Post Republic will be donating a colour correction and the production of a DCP for a suitable pitch project. The winner will be chosen by a three-person expert jury. This year, we are honoured that the producer Cedomir Kolar (CIRCUS COLUMBIA, THE LIGHT THIEF, NO MAN'S LAND), Daria Moheb Zandi (commissioning editor at the regional Berlin-Brandenburg broadcaster RBB) and Rebekka Garrido (The Post Republic) agreed to take part in the jury.



From 6th to 11th November, the FilmFestival Cottbus will be inviting for the 22nd time to a journey through the world of East European film-making. Three competitions and ten programme sections with over 150 films from 36 countries once again promise diverse and interesting insights!

The >Focus < section sees the FilmFestival Cottbus continuing its cinematic exploration of East European diversity under the leitmotif by "Eastern Europe by Religions" and examines the history as well as today's significance of religious life for our Eastern neighbours. The search for the influences of Eastern Europe on international cinema sends the >globalEAST< section this year as far as Spain, South America and the Caribbean region: unusual and fascinating insights into the cinematic connections between the East European and Ibero-American cinema are presented here for the first time. In anticipation of Croatia's accession to the EU next year, the festival will stage a >Special < addressing the more recent development of this country. This year's retrospective will be dedicated in honour of the renowned East German film-maker and film school professor Helke Misselwitz on the occasion of her 65th birthday. Last year's retrospective >Location Lausitz< will be reprised as a regular element in the festival programme and show films that are connected in different ways with the region - whether this be productions by authors from the Lausitz, films about the Lausitz or works made in the Lausitz region. Moreover, a varied supporting programme with readings, film talks, workshops, and exhibitions as well as live concerts and parties will also have plenty to offer besides the screenings in the cinemas.
